What have you learned from your mistakes?

God always wants man to discontinue sin from the earliest warning. Look at a sin in your own life that took a long time to give up. Why did you continue to practice that sin for such a long time? What caused you to repent? I am convinced that there has been no sin in my life that I was not warned against several times before I received the chastisement of the Lord. This shows me how very much God loves me, even when I am being rebellious. However, I am not exempt from God's punishment through His chastisement. God being a merciful, compas-

sionate, loving God, wants us to heed that still small voice of conviction, coming from the Holy Spirit before God has to release His punishment for rebellion. Punishment mostly comes after warnings that have either been neglected or ignored.

I know if I have habits in my life that are displeasing to God, I can pray to God and receive help to replace that sinful habit with a Godly activity. However, I find some people, walking in the flesh, willing to continue practicing sin even after their first or second warning. Somehow they think they will avoid any consequences. God is also a just, holy, righteous, God and He will not ignore His children's disobedience.

Are you willing and able to work for this ministry?

I want to thank God for my ministry board, as they continue to serve the Lord through this ministry. They bring more credibility, and accountability to this ministry. They keep me accountable for all my actions, so this ministry never becomes a dictatorship, or a loss of focus which is the gospel of Jesus. We have attained our individual tax exempt status with our 501 (c) (3) as of Dec. 2011. We want to expand the ministry with a Restoration House Program. We would like to get some people together who would be willing to dedicate as

much time as possible to seeking ongoing support for such a program. The leader would be a board member who could choose people to work with him or her and answer to the rest of the board, seeking funds strictly to start and support a Restoration House Program. This support would have to be ongoing, so the program would not get started only to have to close for lack of funds. I know of a place selling for 1.4 million dollars at the time of this writing, and it is an excellent place for this program. It has a big house and outside buildings

where men could work right on the property, perhaps doing small engine repair. We could have a landscaping business operating from this property. There is enough room in the various buildings to house around twenty men which would be a good number. Not too many to supervise, but enough to help support the ministry. However, we do not have any funds that we could ever make an offer for the property. Come join us if you are up to the challenge.
