Changing Lives From the Inside Out.

What do you know about the God you are serving?

Have you ever heard or read about the attributes of God? Some of the men who'll read this will know what I'm speaking of since I've taught the attributes of God in several prisons.

A. There are two classes of God's attributes:

1. **His natural attributes** relate to God inwardly as He is in Himself. These natural attributes are as follows: Omniscient, Omnipotent, Omnipresent, Eternal, Immutable, Incomprehensible, Selfexistent, Self-sufficient, Infinite, Transcendent, Sovereign. *Omniscient-* God knows all. He has a perfect knowledge of everything that is past, present, and future.

Omnipotent- God possesses all power. He is able to bring about anything that He has decided to do, with or without the use of any source beyond Himself. *Omnipresent-* God is present everywhere, in all the universe, at all times, in the totality of His character.

Eternal - God has no beginning, and He has no end. He is not confined to the finiteness of time or to man's reckoning of time. He is, in fact, the cause of time. Immutable - God is always the same in His nature, His character, and His will. He never changes, and can never be made to change. Incomprehensible - Because God is God, He is beyond the understanding of man. His ways, character, and acts are higher than man's. Man only understands God as He chooses to reveal Himself, His ways, or His purpose.

Self-existent - God depends upon nothing for His existence beyond Himself. The whole basis of His existence is within Himself. At one time nothing but God existed. He added nothing to Himself by creation.

Self-sufficient - By Himself, God is able to act, that is, to bring about His will without any assistance. Although He may choose to use assistance, it is His pleasure, not His need, that governs that choice. Infinite - God has no limits or bounds whatsoever on His person or dominion.

Transcendent - God is above His creation, and He would exist if there were no creation. His existence is totally apart from His creatures or creation.

Sovereign - God is totally, supremely, and preeminently over all His creation. There is not a person or thing that has escaped His control and foreknown plan!

2. His moral attributes reveal God outwardly in His relation to His creation. These moral attributes are: Holy, Righteous, Just, Merciful, Long-suffering, Wise, Loving, Good, Wrathful, Truthful, Faithful, Jealous.

Holy - God is a morally excellent, perfect being. He is totally different from man! His is purity of being in every aspect. Righteous - God is always good. It is essential to His character. He always does the right thing. Ultimately, since He is God, whatever He does is right..... He is absolute. His actions are always consistent with His character, which is love. Just - God is fair in all His actions. Whether He deals with man, angels, or demons, He acts in total equity by rewarding righteousness and punishing sin. Since He knows all, every decree is absolutely just.

Merciful - God is an actively compassionate being. He responds compassionately toward those who have opposed His will in their pursuit of their own way.

Longsuffering - God's righteous anger is slow to be kindled against those who failed to listen to His warnings or obey His instructions. His eternal longing for the highest good for His creatures holds back His holy justice. Wise - God's actions are based on His character. His wisdom causes Him to choose righteous ends and to make the most fitting plans to achieve those ends. Loving - God's love moves Him to give Himself for another, even to the laying down of His own life. His love causes him to desire His creatures' highest good. This is not based upon the worth, response, or merit of the object being loved. Good - In His goodness God gives to others, not what they deserve, but according to His goodwill and kindness toward them

Wrathful - There is within God a hatred for all that is unrighteous and an unquenchable desire to punish all unrighteousness. Whatever is inconsistent with His holy standards must ultimately be consumed.

Truthful - All that God says is reality. Whether believed by man or not, whether seen as reality or not, what God has spoken is reality. Whatever He speaks is truth.

Faithful - God is always true to His promises. He can never draw back from His promises of blessing or judgment.

Jealous - God is unwilling to share what is rightfully and morally His with any other creature.

Needs of the Mi

When I got out of prison 26 years ago I never thought of all the changes that would take place in my life after my release. I knew I felt a call from God to minister to inmates and their families, but I never knew how rewarding it would be to me and my personal walk with the Lord. I tell the men all the time that people think of me as generous for going into the jails and prisons to share Bible studies and worship services; however. I look at it as a chance to make myself study and to create a more intimate relationship with the Lord. Where I could have not spent as much time in the Word, I have to study when I have to preach or teach and this has created better habits in me. So I get

as much or more out of this ministry as I give.

Then there are what I call the open Bible studies where the men come prepared to share their understanding of the Scriptures we are studying. Since many of these men are Bible scholars themselves, no matter how much time I put into a study I cannot cover everything there is to cover, and as these men share their understanding it makes for a very interesting discussion. I go away much more knowledgeable than I came. Of course, with this kind of study there is also the chance someone gets upset when his understanding of God's Word and mine differ. In that case, I always suggest we both go back to our

Bible and look deeper into the Word.

I have many lifetime friends who keep in touch with me after their release from prison. Some of these men, and some inmates still incarcerated, even send financial gifts to the ministry (not to me personally), and some send stamps because they know how many letters go out each week. Unfortunately, there are some who, because of differing understanding of Scripture, no longer attend the Bible studies. This of course makes me sad, but I cannot pretend to agree and mislead someone to think they are right when I believe Scripture states otherwise. There is certainly a lot of that going on today. So I am growing in the Lord by His grace and through the men I serve in the jails and prisons. Praise God!

Thought for:

Jan. 13, 2002 I love you my God. Let not my love be for the blessing alone; let my love be as strong through the good times as through the bad. When men reproach me for my service for you, let my heart be glad for the privilege to come under persecution for the service of Lord. My only strength in those days must come from you. Oh Lord, make me strong in my times of weakness, restore my joy. Do not allow me to submit it to the evil one.

The greatest need of any ministry is lots of earnest prayer: prayer for the men I minister to, for my travel, the message or teachings, for my family and me daily. When I bring a prayer request to you, I know you are going to pray fervently and effectually. James 5: 16 "Confess [your] faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much." Many of the men praying ask me each week about certain prayer requests, such as two babies they were praying for. They do not just say a quick prayer and then forget about that need. This is the kind of prayer that this ministry needs, (and others like it) that depend totally on the generous support of others in order to function.

In the beginning I supported this ministry with a full-time iob, and that worked fine for a while; however, as the ministry grew and my position was more demanding, and more time was required of me, I made a decision to trust in the Lord for all our needs, and He has not once let us down. Phil. 4:19 "But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus." This verse promises He will meet your needs and He has proven it. I have many times mentioned projects this ministry wanted to do which we did not have funds to undertake. Those needs were not met. So after a while God finally got it into my head He is the one who needs to determine what our needs are and to separate them from our wants. Knowing the economy in the future

and when lesus will return, God makes all of His decisions with full knowledge of past, present, and future. So when we pray for something and wait for 26 years and we still do not have it, I am assured by God's Holy Word that if God deems this a need and we do not have it yet, then we need to wait on the Lord's perfect time and not be discouraged. Pro. 3:5,6 5"Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. 6 In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths." If my understanding says something is a need and I don't get it, I need to trust in the Lord. So our greatest need in the ministry is for your prayers that we continue to trust only in the Lord and not what we think about a situation. So pray!
