The Price of Obedience

The Scriptures regarding the birth of Jesus give an extraordinary account of many humble people who are very deeply devoted to the Lord, in sharp contrast to their leaders in Jerusalem. Among them we can find many examples for our own lives.

Mary who said, " Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it unto me according to thy word."

Joseph who was instantly obedient to each of the four dreams God gave him, rising up immediately to do what he was told and take whatever steps were necessary to protect Mary and Jesus no matter how difficult.

Elizabeth who suffered being called barren, not a complimentary term at that time, all her life, and then was called to bear a child when she was getting on in years rather than having a restful old age.

Zacharias who struggled with his faith and was punished for it, and yet his prayers were answered and he was given the important task of raising John the Baptist.

Simeon who waited all his life to see the Consolation of Israel, another name for the Messiah.

Anna devoted herself continually to prayer in her old age, was respected as a prophetess and became a witness to Jesus as the Messiah to all those who came to the temple in faith and were willing to listen.

The Magi traveled hundreds of miles seeking the newborn King so that they might deliver their gifts. They were probably in Bethlehem less than twenty-four hours, just long enough to warn Joseph and Mary that one of them had had a dream regarding Herod.

The Shepherds who gladly left their precious flocks alone in the night to fend for themselves, trusting God to care for the sheep in their absence, and hastened into Bethlehem to see the Babe in the manger.

These people and this story are so familiar that we often take them for granted. But when we examine the accounts closely we begin to realize the difficulties they faced, the risks they took, the hardships they endured, the patience with which they waited, their obedience and the extraordinary things which happened to each one of them.

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The many recorded events about Jesus tell us not only about Him, but about ourselves also.

Both Mary and Joseph had angelic visitations in which each were individually assured that the Child Mary was carrying was indeed the long awaited Messiah. Both of them too were also able to recall the visit of the shepherds and their story of more angels on the hills outside of Bethlehem proclaiming the infant to be the Messiah. And yet here at the temple a mere eight days after they had heard the shepherds' story, they marveled at the things that Simeon prophesied about the baby Jesus. They already knew he was the Messiah, and had had it confirmed by the shepherds and yet they marveled at this further confirmation.

Later on Jesus was visited by three Magi and given very rich presents, and Joseph had three additional dreams regarding the care of the Child and his mother, telling him when to flee to Egypt, when to return, and where to settle. More confirmations of how important Jesus was.

How Quickly We Forget

In time however, as Mary and Joseph had additional children and became concerned with raising them as well as Jesus and with the usual busyness of life, it must have occasionally seemed easy to forget at times just how special Jesus was.

Nine years or so after Joseph's last dream, when Jesus was twelve, they lost track of Him on the way home after Passover and had to search for three days, only to realize that he had been at the temple the whole time. They were so frustrated and worried by the time they found Jesus! But he said to them, "How is it that ye sought me? wist ye not that I must be about my Father's business?" They surely must still know that he was the Messiah and therefore would be protected by God until his mission on earth was complete. But in their frustration at the time they forgot, and didn't really think about what he meant until later (Luke 2:51).

How easy it is for us to forget what God has shown us when we are busy with our lives and with the cares of this world. Thank God that our temporary forgetfulness does not prevent God from still using us to do all that He has planned for us to do. Philippians 1:6 - "Being confident of this very thing, that he which hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ:"
