As in all outreaches, Restoration House will need financial support.



places that use the money inappropriately and the residents do not get the proper care, and the program ends up being a scam. We do not want that either. So we want to remain totally accountable and would welcome someone outside the board to keep the activities of the Restoration House Program accountable. That

Let's remember our mothers while they are with us.

There are many things we think of saying once someone is gone, which we wished we would have said while they were living. That is a fact most people realize too late. So if your mother is still alive, show her all the love you can possibly show her while she can appreciate it. Putting flowers on a grave is done to show honor or love for someone no longer with the person giving the flowers. How much more would the love be appreciated if it was received while they can truly be en-

joyed. So many children take such advantage of their mother, especially these days. Mothers raise their children only to then have to raise their children's children. Adult children come back home to be taken care of by the aging parents instead of the other way around. I know in many cases families need the special care of a nursing home for parents who need special medical care. "It's very sad to go to a nursing home and see elderly folks isolated from their family, whether

their family comes to see them once a week, or not at all. In thinking about honoring your parents this Mother's Day, I challenge you to increase the contact your family have with your mother, or even to consider the possibility that, with enough sacrifice, you could bring her closer to home to live. **Ex. 20:12** "Honour thy father and thy mother: that thy days may be long upon the land which the LORD thy God giveth thee." This was not one of the 10 suggestions.

Some people have a very warm relationship with their father, while some have no thoughts at all except, "where was he all of my life?" However, in many cases the father/child relationship either never existed, or was a very sad time for the children because of the actions of a father laden in sin. I am not suggestion this is the

unforgivable sin as some treat it. I am suggesting that we have a merciful, forgiving God who loves the sinner. **Rom. 5:8** "But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" Let us not be like the Pharisees looking down our noses at sin we have not yet practiced, since we have our own sin to be forgiven for.

Reconciliation

It is called reconciliation. 2 Cor. 5:17-19 17 Therefore if any man [be] in Christ, [he is] a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new. 18 And all things [are] of God, who hath reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ, and hath given to us the ministry of reconciliation; 19 To wit, that God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself, not

imputing their trespasses unto them; and hath committed unto us the word of reconciliation." My question is to believers. Do you actually believe Scripture? If so if someone sinned against you and is now a child of God he or she is a new creature, and reconciled to God. You say "well I do not believe this transition is real." Matt. 7:1-3 1 "Judge not, that ye be not judged. 2 For with what judgment ye judge, ye shall be judged: and with what measure ye mete, it shall be measured

to you again. 3 And why beholdest thou the mote that is in thy brother's eye, but considerest not the beam that is in thine own eye." Matt. 6:15 "But if ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses." Let 2016 be the year of healing and forgiveness. Don't wait for the other person to make the first move, remember God made the first move toward you when He wrote your name in the Lamb's Book of Life.

Overcrowded prisons and lack of staff.

I am seeing more and more there is a shortage of staff in some of the prisons. Since the parole board is still not releasing many of the men and women held under the old law, Virginia prisons are mostly overcrowded. Additionally, from time to time there is a change in leadership, and whenever a new warden comes on, there are bound to be changes, which of course takes time to get accustomed to. Plus, when the staff is short it affects everything in the prison. There has to be an officer present in order to hold programs, so if they are

too short-staffed, the program will be the first option cut in order to have a officer available for a place that needs to be secure, which always takes a priority over any programs. We need to be in prayer for this situation, because a program like a reentry program will not be as productive as it would be if it is run fully staffed by the appropriate number of officers. Also when the program coordinator stays so busy doing other duties that they do not have time to properly communicate with the volunteers for programs and getting new volun-

teers approved, the volunteers, inmates, and their programs suffer. I see this as well in the prisons I work in. The staff is overworked, taking on several job descriptions, and religious programs are never a priority in any prison over things considered a security concern. I am not so much blaming any one person for these issues, but if each prison were more accountable to follow DOC (Department of Correction) guidelines instead of just IOP (institutional guidelines) which may vary prison to prison, things could be run much smother. At

times we even have difficulty ensuring officers remain consistent with IOP guidelines; there can be variation among individual officers in how volunteers are processed into the prison, which directly affects the length and quality of a program. In my 29 years in ministry Satan seem to be making things even harder for Christian volunteers in the last several years. Please pray!
