They hated to give it up after burning wood for heat all of their lives, but after they get used to not having to bring it in from the wood pile to the house in the cold, icy weather, they will be glad for that new heat pump.

Since it is only January we still might have more requests for wood but we have a little stock piled, so when the snow is on the ground we will not need to cut. We want to thank the many people who made this ministry such a success. We have had plenty of help from people, some who do not even burn wood and some from people who help us and we help them get their wood. Many hands make light work. We praise God for this outreach.

Director of Operations

After 28 years praying for the Restoration House and another year getting it ready for residents, we find ourselves once again seeking God for directions and being able to place residents in the house. Although there is still some work needed on the grounds and a little in the house we could move in residents and have them do the work if we had someone to be in charge of running the place. One suggestion made was to not have a director, saying if God has not given you one, perhaps you do not need one. Before we even began seeking a place to start this program we prayed and we had 28 years to hear the Lord. In those years looking at other places we saw places which turned into a flop house shortly after opening and closed shortly after that. We knew if this house was going to be a successful Christian reentry program we would have to present a Godly example for the men to look up to and to be sure all of the mandatory programs were attended faithfully.

I never thought that it would be so hard to find someone to run the house. Our thoughts were if someone was retired and had a check coming in they could afford to run the house for a salary we could afford with free room and meals. That has not been the case. So rather than being discouraged we are praying to God to see if he wants the house used for another purpose. One though is to rent the house out for a time with the understanding, up front, between the renter and us that when we find a director we will give them ample time to find a new place. Another thought is to rent it out and put that money away to pay a better salary for the director to make this position more interesting. As a last resort, we could sell the house and try to find something that would allow residents to have transportation to find jobs more easily. So we ask all of you, especially those who gave so much financially and did so much work on the house to pray for a director and let us know if you have any suggestions as what our next step might be. Thanks!

All of the details are not final at this point but we thought we would get this reminder out to get people aware of when and where it will be. We will be trying to raise funds for the ministry of course. Last year we were VERY blessed to do great to draw in funds and labor for the Restoration House. This year we will put these funds toward other long term needs. We want to be more active in the community through the residents of Restoration House, provided we have a director to open the house for residents. We are going to try to start a landscaping business for the men so jobs will no longer be a problem. The men would have a job right away when they come to the house, and could also seek other, better suited employment while still working. To have a landscaping business, they will need a truck and possibly a trailer to haul a mower, tools, and mulch with as was needed for the job. There are a couple of other businesses we would give thought to for these men and all will require additional funds. Join us in prayer and pan to join us for the banquet!

Still looking for Board members able to serve

Although we only meet as a board once every other month, the new positions that need to be filled will also include working with the Director of Operations for the residents of Restoration House. One of these board members could take on keeping track of all of the financial details for Restoration House. These finances will be separate from the other ministry funds so there will actually be two treasurers. These two board members will meet with the Director and one other board member, and then present all of the activity related to the House with the other board members at our bi-monthly board meetings. These four members will see that all of the house rules and spiritual guidelines are followed, that all of the finances are kept track of, and that bills are paid. They will interact with the residents more regularly than other board members since they have direct authority with all the details of the programs and what the needs of the house and residents are first hand. We encourage readers to search their hearts and see if God might be calling you to one of these board positions or even the director's position. Pray for us as we pray for you all.

Future endeavors for Rehoboth Jail & Prison Ministry

We have many plans for the men who would be living in the Restoration House, but these plans will need to be put on hold if we do not get a Director. I am writing this article on December 6 and as of today, we do not have a Director. I have decided to rent the house out if we do not have a director by the first of the year. We want everyone who has either donated funds or done so much work on the House to see we have not been slack in seeking a director from all of the churches who are affiliated with us. Unless we find an alternative to renting the house out this will likely be out next step. We will rent the house for a time and save the money so when we do find someone willing to be a director we can start him out with a salary. Having funds available to offer as salary might generate interest that has not been available just offering room and food to begin with, until we have residents actually living in the house. We have tried working with a husband and wife from Lynchburg to move into and rent the house. They needed to change locations, but did not have transportation and there were not jobs available in Schuyler, and no bus service from Schuyler to Charlottesville where either of them might find a job. When the House is in full swing with residents, and some finances are coming in, we plan to have a vehicle to get the residents to and from work. So keep praying! We know God is still at work for us, and He has a plan which He has not fully revealed to us yet.

Plans for the new year.

We want to have all of our residents from Restoration House involved in community activities. It might be hard at first, since the being labeled as ex-inmates might scare people off from receiving our help. Certainly the wood cutting ministry could use some help from any residents physically able and willing to help. I would like to find other local projects to help older people on a fixed income to do repairs and help where help is needed. Of course even though the men will be screened thoroughly just one man messing up at an elderly couple's house with ruin the entire program. One thing missing, even if none of the men are guilty, will still shut down the program. We are trusting in God to make it possible for us to show the community Restoration House is not a flop house and that the residents are truly born-again Christians who are an asset to society. We will have to deal with the local parole officer which we do not see a problem with at this point, since I have spoke to him about the possible future program many months ago. We are reverently seeking any new direction God has for us. We know sometimes God has a much better direction for us that where we started to go, we are open to that. My thought for Dec. 1, 2003
