At first I complained about the restrictions put on us by the governor, who I did not have much respect for anyway and then the president also put sanctions on the people. Then someone reminded me of the Scriptures I have reminded people with so many time in the past, about being obedient to the authorities over us. These directives were not against the will of God, so I should obey.

I did hate not going into the prisons teaching the Bible studies and the gathering of believers on Sunday for worship and praise to God. However, it gave me a small look at what Christians in North Korea and China and many others go through all of the time as they try to worship our Lord Jesus.

Like many people at the time of this writing, I am staying home and many kind and loving brothers and sisters are shopping for me, and I have many concerns about how long this will be going on; with people out of work and the economy suffering so much. Again, I remember reading how when the Jews faced trials in the desert coming to the promised land they murmured and complained and did not pray. I also remember the results of that complaining and I do not want that outcome for us during these trying times, so we need to pray. I pray for this virus situation to be ended and those who caught it healed, of course. However, I am also praying for God to open my eyes to why He has allowed it to happen and what it is I need to learn while this is going on.

We have seen many kindnesses brought forth from many who might not call themselves Christians, just as we see many people taking advantage of this situation hording and reselling items for twice the cost to make a profit. The gas prices are as low as they have been in a long time, but we are not allowed to go anywhere; however, that still helps those who still have jobs and have to drive to and from work every day.

Things could be better, however they will get much worse. I am not a gloom and doom minister, but I have read the Bible cover to cover and I know what is to come. It does not matter how long it has been since these prophecies were made. I trust them to be true. I do happened to be one of many who believe the church will not be here when things get to the worst. If you are one who see things differently and that we will be here during tribulation I give you my permission to tell me, "I told you so." Pro. 3:5, 6 5 Trust in the LORD with all your heart, And lean not on your own understanding; 6 In all your ways acknowledge Him, And He shall direct your paths. Do vou know Him?

Pen pals are still plentiful if you want to share God's love and still stay home.

The new pen pal brochure explains how you can e-mail inmates for less than mailing a letter, and some prisons even have a free e-mail system that does not cost either person. Even if it cost \$0.55 to send a letter sharing God's love, isn't worth it? What did Jesus pay to show His love for us? It was far more than \$0.55 I assure you. Do you remember when you first got saved, how you could not wait to tell everyone about Jesus? What happened? I happen to be one who thinks the fast pace of the world is not a good thing; instant everything. No one wants to hardly call anyone— just send a text. Some are so short you can't figure out what they are trying to say. Visiting friends and family used to be a very enjoyable time, and it still is for many, but others are too busy! I mean too busy period! Many people have their priorities arranged in such a way that their time is spent on things other than sharing God's love and themselves with others. It does not take a lot of time to write or type a letter or e-mail a message of what God is doing in your life to encourage someone else. <u>The</u> <u>days are close to the coming of the</u> <u>Lord.</u> What are you doing with the time left he is allowing you? Read Matt **25:15-28**



WHAT DO YOU FEAR AND WHY DO YOU FEAR IT?

Since I write these newsletters ahead of time so the editors can straighten out the grammar and other mistakes, this article is meant to address the corona COVID-19 virus which is going on as I actually write this in March.

At first I was angry with how little many Christians seemed, to me, to trust in the Lord being able to protect us from this virus. People are willing to go to foreign countries where dangerous things are happening all of the time and where Christians are being persecuted and killed regularly. Some go into dangerous prisons and preach the Word. Some stand on street corners in very bad neighborhoods and share the gospel, but many Christians seem to be in a panic over this virus. Of course I know not everyone is panicking, but many who are should not be.

Thanks to several wise Christian friends. I have come to appreciate the importance of being extra cautious, but without panic, and fear, and without judging those who are fearful for what ever reason. My pastor shared many times in his messages to be submissive to the authorities over us, such as when our government strongly suggests not gathering with more than 10 people so churches are closing. I feel there is more behind this virus than just the virus itself. I would not be surprised if someone did not create this virus and purposely allowed it to start this infection for reasons I cannot even imagine. Of course this is just my

thought that came to <u>my</u> mind. I have no evidence of this. I know I see people in the government trying to use the panic of this virus for their own political gain, which does not surprise me at all.

So what are some the answers? 2 Chr. 7:14 "if My people who are called by My name will humble themselves, and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land." When this virus first appeared, I started praying. However, I almost allowed my own opinion of what people should do and how they should do it, to cause me to not realize God works in people's lives differently and everyone does not see things the same way. One lady started mentioning how many unsaved people seem to be doing good for many. If that draws them to Jesus then that is great. If not the good they are doing is only good in the eyes of society.

I have seen, first hand for the first time in my life, what it is like to be ordered to stay home, not to gather with more than ten people, and be given a list of reasons I can leave the house limited to what the government see as rational. I now have more compassion and sympathy for countries like North Korea, China, and many Muslim dominated countries where Christians face death, not a fine, for gathering for any kind of worship. I thank God for having patience with me when I start off on my soap box about the wrongs of society or our government in the restrictions, and I thank good brothers and sisters for encouraging me with fortifying Scripture as to the right way to look at things when I am not in agreement. Isn't it a shame, no matter how Spiritually sound one might be, that they sometimes need to be reminded God is sovereign? He knows how this virus started, how long it will continue, who it will affect, and who will die from it. Having that assurance soundly in my heart, my responsibility is to be obedient, conscious, praying, using my time wisely to receive anything God is trying to show me, and to fear not for God is with me. Deut 31:6 "Be strong and of a good courage, fear not, nor be afraid of them: for the LORD thy God, he [it is] that doth go with thee; he will not fail thee, nor forsake thee." While this verse has a specific meaning in this context, throughout Scripture God encourages His children to fear not. The words fear not are used 144 time in the King James Bible. So all I am saying is love and trust the Lord with all your heart Matt 22:37-40 37 Jesus said to him, " 'You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.' 38"This is the first and great commandment. ³⁹"And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' 40"On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets." (Pro. 3:5)
