“The Road to Salvation”



One of the first questions most people ask when they are touched by the Holy Spirit is, "What must I do to be

saved?" Sometimes people use these scriptures to receive Jesus as their Lord and Savior. It is sometimes called the Roman Road.

Rom. 3:23 “For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God;” *This simply means you are not alone. Every-one on earth has sinned, and they are all lost on their way to hell, and in need of a Savior.*

Rom. 6:23 “For the wages of sin [is] death; but the gift of God [is] eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.” *This simply means the payment for any sin is death, that death is separation from God, but when we take Jesus*

into our lives, He pays the debt for our sins, since He died once for all who would receive Him.

Rom. 5:8 “But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.” *Jesus loves those God has chosen for Himself so much he died to pay for their sins, so they would not ever be separated from God either here on this earth or after their lives here are over. Everyone will spend eternity someplace. The unsaved will not be annihilated as some teach. They will spend eternity in hell which was originally created for Satan and his demons. The saved will spend eternity in the presence of God.*

Rom. 10:13 “For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.” *As the Holy Spirit makes someone aware of the need for Jesus, that one will cry out for the one true God (not just any god). As the Holy Spirit gives the believer the faith to believe without proof of God, as the believer accepts Jesus, the Holy Spirit comes in to live within the believer forever.*

Rom. 10:9 “That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved.” *Just to say the words, “I want you as my Savior, Jesus,” is not enough. You have to believe God exists and what Scripture says about His character, in order to be truly saved.*

Rom. 12: 1, 2 1 “I beseech (beg) you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, [which is] your reasonable service. 2 And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing

of your mind, that ye may prove what [is] that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.” *If someone truly desires to change one’s life he or she must give up the old life, as God gives the strength to do so. You will backslide, and you will not be perfect; however, you will be convicted to repent as you do wrong. If you are truly saved and do not repent (turn away from sin and to God), God will chastise you and bring you back under His sovereign power and authority.*

If someone follows these steps and is truly seeking God he or she will start noticing a change in their life. When they sin, they will no longer enjoy it. They will feel guilt which comes from the conviction from God through His Holy Spirit, since this person now belongs to God. Jesus paid a debt with His life for that person and when they receive Jesus that person is saying, “I give up all my rights to you God. I am now your slave and totally dependent on you.” These changes will come as you submit to God’s will and reject the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life which was the cause and the fall of Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden.
