The Day of Jubilee started as a reunion for volunteers I met while I was incarcerated. They were invited to come to my house and enjoy, food, fellowship, and praise God for His ministry to some of the least of God children. Along with the volunteers we also invited inmates who had been released, and their families. We started the day with much praise to God for the work He had done in the lives of many of the ex-inmates who were present, and extended that praise for other inmates still being touched by those ministries who were represented, and now to Rehoboth Jail & Prison Ministry which had not yet received that name.

Although I began going into the jails in 1987, there was no outside support for the ministry at that time, other than a love offering for my travel from time to time by individuals who knew

me. I supported the ministry with my job as a plumber, and raising cows and hogs to help with the cost of travel. It was not until around Sept 1992 that the ministry started getting some small, but pretty regular, donations. It was at that time I was advised to create a board and appoint a treasurer. We wanted to keep everything above board, especially since I was an exoffender and still under the scrutiny of some who might doubt my integrity. So from some members of the church, we created a board to keep me accountable, and from the very beginning I have not controlled any of the money. Even though the checks come to the ministry address, they are deposited by a treasurer. Later on, as board members left and other people interested in the ministry joined the board, more people from other churches and even other

denominations joined which made the board more diverse.

Gradually we formed bylaws, a constitution, job descriptions, and in September 29, 2010, we applied for a tax-exempt status. We had been working under the church's status, where I was the pastor when we first started receiving funds; however, because we desired to buy land and be on our own we decided to try for a taxexempt status. After over a year, in Dec. 2011 we were approved as a nonprofit 501(c) (3) organization. We have so much to be thankful for. I am especially thankful for the present and past board members who made this ministry what it has become through the anointing of the Lord. I am also VERY grateful for all of the prayers and financial support from the very beginning. May God bless vou all.


showed Himself superior in every way. Still each time they reverted to serving the gods of the

Are there any hidden idols you are serving or that you are putting before Jehovah and His commandment, "if you love me then obey me?"

The Pen Pal Ministry is growing. Are you involved yet?

Right now I have 15 pen pals writing to male and female inmates, women to women and men to men. Some of those pen pals are writing up to 3, even 4 inmates, but most of them just 1. As I write this, I am writing around 62 inmates and 8 men who used to be locked up but still keep in touch. Tomorrow this number could change, and by the time you read this I am sure that number will have changed. In the last 3 weeks I have gotten 10 new inmates,

with two inmate requests three days in a row for a pen pal. When I do not have any pen pals signed up, I write these men until I can find a family to





write and take some of these men for pen pals. As I have mentioned before I

> like to write at least three letters to get a feel of the pen pal's desires before I choose a suitable pen pal for him. If he needs spiritual guidance, of course I would give this pen pal a more mature Christian to write him.

We are trying to revive an interest in Restoration House.

This past spring and summer we have been once again mentioning more regularly the desire on our part and the need on the inmate's part for a place for men to be released to. This would be for men who have no place to go to live until they get on their feet. We are not talking about a flop house where men lay around all day, or work and have little or no supervision during their stay. We have devised a 12-month

Christian program with complete accountability for each resident 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. They will work

and pay their way, and when not working they will be supervised by a Director of Operations who will live in the house. There will be 4 devotionals each day, Bible studies each day, household chores, and each of

these will be mandatory! We can make all of the forms, literature, and information available to any church, business,

or individual who might have an interest in knowing more or being involved, either in running the house or by providing financial support. If you have no other interest, we would ask for your prayers.
