I remember on Christmas we went to McDonalds and had \$.15 hamburgers for dinner. I can not remember why they were opened on Christmas but I remember what a treat it was to go to McDonalds for Christian. I remember it being so cold we all slept in our clothes in one bed and waking up and eating what every we had for breakfast and thinking this is the best Christmas ever. My family was not close to God back to them but we all recognized this as a time when Jesus was

born. Since that time I have had many bountiful Christmases' with great meals and lots of presents, but that Christmas stand out in my mind because we felt close as a family and we did not need materials things to make us happy. I say all of this to say, this year on Christmas there will be hungry, homeless people who will have to go to s soup kitchen to get a hot meal, so try to be content that you have a home, a job, a family and church family if you have one, and not to go over board with material gifts within the family. By a group giving up their Monday nights at Buckingham prison I actual gained their evening services to add to the 3 Mondays I was already having a Bible study. So you might say well what are you complaining about. We use to have 60 to 80 men at some of the Bible studies, but since the change and the men only being allowed to go to church or Bible study a majority of the men do not want to miss church. So those numbers have been reduces to 4 at one prison and 3 at the other.

Many men would love to grow in their understanding of God's word but had to choose

between that and a church service with singing and praises to God and an inmate choir which the men enjoy and many sing in.

You know when I find out the crimes of many of the men which at time was against their own family I fully understand why their family do not have anything to do with them. But it does and wives are left to support their children and clean up the mess the inmate left behind. I know if this man has made this promise over and over family is not likely to believe their will be a change. The I think of my relationship with Jesus and how many time I promised Him if he got me out of this mess, I would do better next time. However each time I would return to the old life. I am thankful even though I paid a price for my disobedience God never gave up on me. I guess that is why I will not give up one the men and women who do the same crimes over and over and have lost every friend they eve had. As I stick to the pen pal guidelines and share Jesus I do not allow my self up to be taken advantaged of. If they do not want the gospel they will eventually stop writing, if they want things the ministry does not provide and I just remind them we do not do that, they will eventually stop writing.

Then there are some many who are sick and tired of living the old life and they are really seeking someone to share their walk with Jesus with. This make it all worth wild. I am not responsibility for their salvation. I am only obligated to share Jesus and the rest is up to the Holy Spirit. Come join me!

It is not a strange thing the way the DOC is cutting programs, cutting back on decent food for the inmates, very limited medical care and other cuts. Our government is wasteful and they try to save money on the wrong things. Of course it does not help that the inmates waste as well and the officers and staff do as little as possible to get their pay like many government employees. If you are not one of these kinds of workers, do not get upset with the article, since all you have to do is look around at some of your fellow workers and you know what I am talking about.

The state receives federal money for each inmate the DOC has in the reentry programs. Many of the men forced into the program disrupt the program for men who actually think it will help them when they get out. They are forced or they lose good time. The material for the program is expensive to put together so it is not updates in a timely manner and much of it is out dated in a short time and many address for inmate to contact after their release are not longer operating.

Men who have no place to parole to are held longer at times for not having an address be released to. One of my pet peeves is the fact that while the prisons are supposed to help these men and women to find a home plan, and they have people paid to do that; I have been ask by many men if I know of any place they could stay until they get on the feet, a halfway house or shelter. I ask them what their counselor is doing to help them and they explain how little many counselors do for the inmates. Now I realize some men might be critical of the staff but when men I know and trust tell me the same thing, I know our tax dollars are paying salaries for many of these workers who are skating by doing a little to actually help inmates. Not all of course, there are many good hard working counselors working for the DOC.

Rehabilitating starts with a desire to change from the old way to better ways. Man left to his own does not desire to change nor is he able to make the necessary change. That is why having as many Christian programs presenting Jesus is a necessity. Pray for this!







## News from the Bible Reading Outreach ministry.

We are greatly inspired as we receive many letters requesting a bible and a bible study lesson where the requests have learned about the lessons from someone else taking the lessons and that person witnessing to them about the Lord. In other situations the requester will simply write they have seen a difference in a person taking the lessons and they want to have what that person has. Sometimes, and so very often, our witness to someone can simply be a calm spirit, a smiling face, a caring heart, being seen with our head bowed in thankfulness for a meal, listening when someone needs to talk, and so many, many simply things. We can see changes in many of those who have received bibles and

are taking the bible lessons as the notes and letters then sent will be filled with praise and thankfulness for God even in their current situations. We have had some who were refused parole, and yet their letter to us stated something like, "I am not upset, although obviously I wanted to be released. But God has a plan and will allow the release when it's His time." We have seen God working in many hearts and in answered prayers.

In January of this year we started sending out birthday cards to all active participants. The response of those who have received the cards has been overwhelming. You can read the joy and smile in the notes and letters we get in gratitude for the birthday card and, for many, the card we send will be the only acknowledgement of their birthday. We are so thankful God gave us the thought to do this small task and so thankful that it makes those who receive the card feel as if someone cares. How wonderful that our Lord cares so much for each of us. May God have the Glory!

The active enrollment in the ministry has begun to reach an annual high of 520 active participants, while approximately 30 - 45 are moved to inactive status annually. We are thrilled to see that many of the inactive participants are returning over time and that reinforces "the Lord's Word will not return void!"
