What was the first Thanksgiving all about?

The event that Americans commonly call the "First Thanksgiving" was celebrated by the Pilgrims after their first harvest in the New World in October 1621. This feast lasted three days, and—as recounted by attendee Edward Winslow—was attended by 90 Native Americans and 53 Pilgrims. The English colo-

nists we call Pilgrims celebrated days of thanksgiving as part of their religion. But these were days of prayer, not days of feasting. Our national holiday really stems from the feast held in the autumn of 1621 by the Pilgrims and the Wampanoag to celebrate the colony's first successful harvest. According to what tradition-

ally is known as "The First Thanksgiving," the 1621 feast between the Pilgrims and the Wampanoag at Plymouth Colony contained waterfowl, venison, lobster, clams, berries, fruit, pumpkin, and squash.

This is the annual report from Mrs. Barbara Holmes and her daughter Beke. "The Bible Readers Outreach Ministry" 2020

- As you know we have implemented some new "rules" and practices such as the following:
- A new participant needs to complete the 4 lessons on John to receive a Bible
 - A person who has completed the New Testament receives a Study Bible of their choice (if possible) and a Strong's Concordance
 - A person who is starting 1st Corinthians can have a Bible cover if they choose.
 - A participating male (starting in the Old Testament) receives an article about a man of the Bible – one with each lesson – 100 men of the Bible is used.
 - A participating female (starting the Bible studies in the New Testament) receives an article about a woman of the Bible – one with each lesson – 137 women of the Bible is used.
 - A couple of women help a couple of days each week, allowing Mom to have time to write encouraging notes, answer biblical questions, research for creating new lessons for Old Testament books.

We are so pleased with the responses to these new practices. Additionally, we receive 100's of "thank you's" for the Birthday cards. And are extremely please to see the new participants who start the lessons seem to be staying, even after they receive their Bible!
