Changing Lives From the Inside Out

A ladies' Testimony

I grew up in church I gave my life to God at age 7. I lived for God all through my childhood and teenage years. Then in my mid twenties I lost my grandmother and I gave up on life I was mad and angry at God for taking my grandmother so within 2 years I turned my back on God walked out of marriage and family. I got with my ex boyfriend and started on a path of self destruction with getting into the bisexual and gay lifestyle and pornography meeting people off the internet for sex and was on the road leading straight to hell for 11 months. Then I find myself in jail facing 70 years for a sex crime that ultimately destroyed my life, my reputation I had finally hit the bottom of the bottomless pit all I could do was look up and cry for God's mercy and to save me from myself and He did He sat me down in prison for 17 1/2 years to get my attention. Then on December 14, 2012 my world fell apart I lost my dad I was so angry at God I hated Him and turned away from anything to do with God I went and lived my life on my own terms I was still in the gay lifestyle and I had several girlfriends and turned the natural into the unnatural use of my body. Then the end of October 2020 I had reached the end of my rope. I was tired of being judges rejected Pastors not having anything to do with me telling me I was going to hell so I had made up my mind I did not want anything to do with Christianity, God and I did not even want to hear anything. I called my

sister told her what I was doing she asked me to give her 48 hours. Within 24 hours she had me Bro Townsend information and that he was waiting for my call. So November 3 2020 I called him expecting to get turned away But he did not turn me away. The only way to say it happened was a divine intervention. He was the first person in 17 years to accept me gave me hope He has been there with me through the last year of my sentence He worked with me showed me the Truth showed me what a real Christian was. He was praying for me and through him you the church family voted 100% that I belonged there at the church you all accepted me without knowing anything about me or who I was. God knew all along who I needed and by your prayers, your acceptance, your love for God and others is what brought me out of Hell. I was physically released on 12-17-2021 after serving 17 years 2 months 21 days. I have probation for 5 years so they were not letting me go to church but again Bro. Townsend and the church family went to bat for me my probation officer game permission for Bro. Townsend to baptize me at the church with no one there so that was December 31st 2021 Bro Townsend called me asked me when I wanted to do it. So I decided that I am starting a new life and a new journey I wanted to start off on the right foot so Saturday January 1, 2022 he baptized me in Jesus name here at the church. From

that day until March 7, 2022 we fought probation for me to be able to attend services finally on March 9th 2022 on a Wednesday night. I stepped foot in the door of new life church. Immediately I felt love, & peace. I felt that I had come home from a long journey I was the prodigal daughter coming home. It has only gotten stronger every time I step foot in this door so my new journey began. God used each one of you to show me what love, acceptance and hope looked like. It is through your prayers fasting teaching and acceptance that I was totally and ultimately set free on July 10, 2022 when God filled me with the Holy Ghost. Thank you for opening up your lives, heart, church to this Prodigal Daughter. Thank you for all of you who has helped me these last 9 months. Thank you all for the sacrifice you've made on getting me to the services. I love each and every one of you. You all are in my heart and you are my family. I am honored to be named among you. New life is the perfect name for this church because of you this church has given me a new life. By: Barbara Sellers

Next month will be the 38th Day Of Jubilee

In March of 2024 this ministry began it 39th year of ministry. We are very thankful for all of the support from those who help physically in the working of the ministry. Like the volunteers who actually go into the prisons. The Bible Outreach Ministry, mailing out the 100's of Bible studies those who are in constant prayer for all of the workers and for those who look at this ministry of being worthy of their financial giving. We always pray for an interesting turn out for the Jubilee, as we try to invite new released inmates to share their testimonies. However in VA the parole Board is not releasing many men each year. In fact at Buckingham there are men who have been turned down for parole after 47 years of going up year after year with a perfect institutional record for the last 30 years. Without Christ these men and women would of lost hope years ago, so that is one of the best reasons for prison ministries taking the love of God and His precious Word into them. We want to reassure them there is hope in Jesus. Even in prison being turned down for parole the same trivial reasons all those years, many of the Christians hold fast to their relations with Jesus and they are encouraged and lifted up by the volunteers taking the Word of God to them and showing His love to them. ³⁶ I was naked and you clothed Me; I was sick and you visited Me; I was in prison and you came to Me. Matthew 25:36 Let us continue praying for those incarcerated.



Up date on Ministry for 2024 so far.

Lets start with thanksgiving for all of the prayer support from inmates all over as they pray daily and mention in the letter they are praying an responding to our request mentioned for prayer. Along with their prayers we also have many individuals and church as a whole praying for us and these much needed prayers are greatly appreciated. As in every ministry there are expenses and for the financial supporters we can not thank you enough for feeling we are worthy of you support even as the cost of living is much higher each day.

We now had Some fresh volunteers going into the two prisons we are minister in and we are asking for prayer that hey will remain strong since the institutions do not make it easy to serve the Lord since it add work for the officers and other staff.

Here are some prayer request for everyone. Pray for the Board members, pray for the volunteers who work to share God's Word and His love to those society would just as soon forget.

I have noticed a great loss of memory as I work each day on the ministry work. Doing Bible lessons, do messages for when I preach, and as I have to

use the Internet to look up inmates and their crimes before I give them a pen pal. I can look at something and as I try to move to what I am looking for what I am trying for find I often have to stop and try to remember what I was thinking just a few minutes ago. I have explained this to my board and although it might take longer for me to do my work it is still be accomplished by the grace of God and lots of prayer on my part and for many of you. I mention this for special prayer for God to allow me to keep doing the work of the ministry until He takes me home, and if He take me home while the ministry is still a part of His plan He will provide someone enthusiastic and qualified to run the ministry according to God's perfect will.

The inmates need prayer for more humane treatment, such as better meals, not being lockdown so often when it is not necessary to the security of the prison, The was the mailing system if causing he mail go to through third party places to be checked for drug residue prayer sprayer on the letter or the envelope. This entails the letter being copies and sent electronically to the inmate which makes the letter even longer getting to the pen pal. Plus in order for the inmate to get the electronic letter in he or she does not have a tablet they have to use a kiosk machine and there are a lot of inmates using it so that also make it even longer for them to get their mail.

Jay-pay is a good way to write individual if you only writing to individuals in the same state, but each state has differed rules and prices so for this ministry it would be very confusing to have an account it each of the 50 states where we write.

Please pray for the shortage on officers and staff in the prisons all over the USA. Many prisons have the inmate's counselors doing so much work that the work with or for in inmate take the back seat. So when an inmate get close to his release date it is hard to almost impossible for him or her to get help with a home plan what is necessary for an inmate to be released on parole or probation.

Pray that incarcerated peoples and their families will receive a personal relationship with the Lord Jesus. Pray that God will fulfill the dream of Restoration House where men can be paroled upon release. Pray that the D.O.C. reduces the burden on volunteers and pen pals.

This is the update for Rehoboth Jail & Prison Ministry and Bible Readers Outreach Ministry for the months of Non/Dec 2024

Bible Readers Outreach Ministries:

In April. 2024 we mailed out 232 Bible lessons, enrolled 36 new students, mailed 11 Bibles at \$239.18, 4 Bible dictionaries/concordances at \$75.22. Old testament Vernon Magee concordances 3 &@ \$76.46 Misc. office materials (paper, envelopes, ink, cardstock) \$200.00, Stamps \$101.60 for a total of \$ 692.46

In May 2024 we mailed out 237 Bible lessons enrolled 16 new students, mailed 6 Bibles cost of \$151.70 1 Bible dictionaries/Concordances at \$17.42 and 4 Old testament Vernon Magee concordances \$99.55 Misc. office materials (paper, envelopes, ink, cardstock) \$0 Stamps \$0 for a total of \$ 268.67 +

In April 2024 I wrote 51 letter and received 18 new request during that month for volunteer pen pal. New volunteers to write inmates. None

In may 2024 I wrote 39 letter and received 6 new request during that month for volunteer pen pal. New volunteers to write inmates. None

I also received 1 letter written in Spanish which I had translated . So I could read and try to write back. I used Google translater to translate my letter into Spanish since I do not have any Hispanic volunteers. Then I had is checked to see if it seemed correct.

Please keep both divisions of this ministry in your prayers. Since I send the letter to be edited and give the editors time to edit I go back a few months so we can get an accurate count and not have to wait until the last day to add the month before the newsletter goes out.
