The God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. Their admiration was a deep-rooted tribute; not the shallow selfish songs we sometimes hear from our popular cultural singers in today's world. These songs of praise originated from the very

soul of God—fearing men and women. Their praise boiled out forming a well-spring that honored their Creator and not the creation. They "entered into God's gates with thanksgiving in their hearts and into his courts with praise!"

After this wonderful preparation was laid, the worshippers were ready to commune with Almighty God in fear humble reverent known as Prayer. The privilege of knowing God, coupled with the heart-felt praise they rendered to him laid the foundation whereby they could now surrender themselves and cry out to him to meet their needs, desires, and other necessary requirements they had for themselves or for others. They were all of one mind, and they worshipped together, because they knew from experience and testimony that the God they served was a living God who would listen to their cries and pleas for help and supply all their needs according to his riches in glory. The experience they shared together in true worship came from their spirit since they understood that "God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship Him in Spirit and in Truth.'

Finally, when they worshipped in this manner they were filled with **Peace.** Why? Because we serve a triune God made up of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. All in one and one in all. His name is above all names. His name is Jesus, the Prince of Peace. Why? Because God's Holy Word is Truth and states plainly that; "the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." Jesus said, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to

you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." Paul writes; "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self—control."

In August 2025 we mailed 260 Bible lessons, enrolled 24 new students, mailed 10 Bibles cost of \$204.63, 8 Bible dictionaries/Concordances at \$121.63, 3 Old testament Vernon McGee concordances at \$63.35; Misc. office materials (paper, envelopes, ink, cardstock) \$106.71 and Stamps \$649.74 for a total of \$1146.06

In Sept 2025 we mailed out 256 Bible lessons, enrolled 14 new students, mailed 12 Bibles cost of \$241.41, 5 Bible dictionaries/ Concordances at \$66.10, 1 Old testament Vernon McGee concordance at \$18.91; Misc. office materials (paper, envelopes, ink, card-stock) \$227.67 and Stamps \$120.54 for a total of \$674.63
